You can use any two contrasting prints or solids for the Light Fabrics and Dark Fabrics. The pictured quilt is done in white with black prints and black with white prints. You could do it in reds, navys, etc. You could also use two blender fabrics such as Grunge, or Marbles, etc. Your Solid fabric should be either a solid or read as a solid.

Your Centers should be strong contrast to your Light and Dark fabrics.
You can either make all centers the same color, and use the yardage given for the Solid fabric. If you choose to use multiple colors for your centers, you will need pieces that are at least 4 " by 8 ". If using FQ, do not cut until you get to class.

Note: All cutting will be done in class.
Use the chart below for yardage:

| Light Fabric | $11 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$ or 5 FQ | $13 / 4 \mathrm{Yd}$ or 7 FQ | $31 / 2 \mathrm{yd}$ or 14 FQ | $51 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$ or 21 FQ | 8 yd or 33 FQ |
| Dark Fabric | $11 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$ or 5 FQ | $13 / 4 \mathrm{Yd}$ or 7 FQ | $31 / 2$ yd or 14 FQ | $51 / 4$ yd or 21 FQ | 8 yd or 33 FQ |
| Binding | 1/2 yd | 2/3 yd | $3 / 4 \mathrm{yd}$ | 1 yd | 1 yd |
| Batting | Twin | Twin | Twin | King | King |

- Sewing machine - don't forget the electric cord, foot control, feet and any other electrical requirements
- Normal sewing supplies
- Rotary mat and cutter
- Whatever ruler you use to cut across WOF.
- A $4^{\prime \prime}$ by $12^{\prime \prime}$ ruler for sub-cutting would be useful if you have one.
- Marking pencil to contrast with your fabrics.
- Long pins, or safety pins, or wonder clips or clothes pins. Something to clip 12 layers of fabric together. You could also use snack size plastic bags.
