

Linda's trunk show includes garments and quilts representing principles of design that you can keep in your head while creating traditional and/or art quilts. She will discuss shortcuts & techniques to make your quilts come alive! You will learn how to use these design principles to create classically beautiful art quilts & garments, & also learn how to use fabric paints, fusibles, heat guns, cracked ice, Solvy, Lutradur, Tyvek, Angelina & Tintzi fiber, Puff Paint, foil & many other substances to create special effects while remaining true to the quilting tradition.

**Friday January 26, Art Quilt and Garment Techniques 9:30-4:30pm HCC**

This is a very fun combination demonstration/hands-on workshop where you get to experience various construction & embellishment techniques, including: fabric painting, stenciling, various methods of machine piecing & appliqué, machine embroidery & thread painting, use of Solvy disappearing medium, embellishment with foil & foil glue, creation of fabric from thread & snippets, & free-motion quilting.

The workshop includes basic insights & techniques of pattern manipulation, garment design, & thread-play. This is a process class where the emphasis is on the development of a person's knowledge of various techniques to be able to make their own vision a reality. You will NOT come out of this class with a finished project, but with ideas on how to design, construct & embellish your own inimitable creations. It's a play-time, fun time, learning & growing experience you won't want to miss!



**Whimsical Waterfalls Sat. Jan 26 9:30-4:30pm**

There are many ways of making waterfalls – this class lets you play with most of those ways, using very cool stuff to create your little landscape using MistyFuse, metallic paint powders, Lutradur, Puff Paint, Tyvek, fabric paints, iridescent cracked ice, painted melted cellophane, sheer fabrics, roving, Angelina & Tintzi fibers & more. You will come away with a small, landscape art piece pinned & ready to sew, & lots of inspiration for new projects.

Kit fee of \$20 includes full instructions & pattern, Puff Painted tree & rocks, Tyvek; iridescent cracked ice; Mistyfuse; Lutradur; Angelina fiber, cellophane & use of fabric paints, metallic paint powders, fine iridescent glitter & Shiva Paintstiks.

## ***SOME OF THE "GYPSY" JOURNEY QUILTS DISPLAYED AT THE RETREAT***



### **Faith, Hope, Love**

In Oct 1999 I had an emergency appendectomy. It turned out to be a very large malignant tumor. In November, I had another surgery to remove a large portion of my right large intestine, to make sure they got all the cancer cells. While recuperating, and unbeknown to me, my quilt group, the Boulder Cut-Ups, made individual quilt blocks for me. As it turned out, there were an equal number of pieced and appliqued blocks. What a wonderful surprise. I asked the girls if each one would give me a small piece of one of the fabrics she used in her block. I then used them in each corner to tie the blocks together. After assembling the quilt and adding embellishments, I hand-quilted it. I finally finished it in 2003. I entered it in the 2003 Quilt show in the Group Category. It took a first place ribbon.

Now that I have been diagnosed with Chronic Lymphocytic Leukemia, I love my quilt and the Cut-Ups that much more.

This quilt, Broken Promises, took me on a twenty year journey through today's date. It was completed in September 1997.

It began when my husband of 24 years told me that he wanted a divorce. The word "divorce" had never been spoken before February 28, 1997. He left the following day and the shock of this announcement paralyzed me with fear, confusion, distrust, lack of confidence, and so many questions.

Once I realized that he was serious about ending our marriage, I turned to my consistent therapy ~ quilting ~ to get me through this disastrous period in my life. I assembled several fabrics that expressed my shattered feelings; the murky grey, pale maize, the tense striped gold and rust, all tied together with a funereal-like bow. My dissolving bridal bouquet was hand stitched and quilted as I considered my future options. The three special needs children, that we had adopted just three years previously, were devastated, but life went on. Now that twenty years have passed, I've made peace with my ex-husband, raised three pre-teens to adulthood, and supported myself with fifteen different jobs while keeping my sanity intact by quilting, quilting, quilting. QUILT TRAVELS FROM STATE OF ILLINOIS TO EUROPE AND BACK AGAIN DURING WWII (narrative edited for space)

This quilt was given to me by my cousin along with the story that was passed on to her so this is documentation as true as we can figure.

Sarah (Sally) Lindsey Meisenheimer (1878-1934) was born, raised and died in Southern Illinois. She was the mother of 12 children: 8 daughters and 4 sons. Child #11 was Edward Duncan Meisenheimer (1919-1995). When he was 20 years old, war was declared (WWII). His mother Sally had been dead for 5 years and in another 5 years his father, nicknamed Squire Meisenheimer, would also be dead. Edward enlisted in the Army. He was in Europe and Australia. Eventually he changed branches of military service to the Air Force. During one of his European tours he met and married Suzie. She was petite and smart, and was from Germany. She talked funny (said "ziss and zat" for this and that). She was also handy with a needle, be it hand sewing or knitting.

Coming to the history of the quilt – we believe Edward's mother Sally Meisenheimer made the quilt and he carried it with him throughout his career travels. There is a patch and some darning on the back of the quilt. We don't know about the patch but feel strongly that Suzie did the darning repairs since none of our family did this type of mending.

This quilt is so worn and ragged that many people would just pitch it out but to a quilter, it is history and warm with all the untold stories about lives and travels. If only our quilts could talk!
