## **DEVELOPING A QUILTING CLASS**

Some of us like to take quilting classes. Some of us like to teach quilting classes. Some of us like to do both but there is a huge difference between teaching a class and taking a class. The main difference is in the preparation. When we take a class we first need to learn about the class. Who, What, When and Where? After making the decision whether or not to take the class, we sign up, pay a fee and eagerly read the supply list. We often spend a lot of time (and money) getting all the supplies together. But the teacher offers a kit, Yipeee! Our prep time is reduced. So after all the supplies and equipment are ready we arrive at the class and follow the teacher's instructions. Sometimes the instructions are delivered as a handout. Sometimes they are delivered as a demonstration. And, now in this age of technology, they might even be offered as a CD. But no matter how they are delivered to the students, the teacher had to plan the class and prepare the instructions; as well as plan and prepare the teaching schedule, the class samples, the class schedule, the student kits, etc.

Teaching a quilting class involves a lot of behind-the-scenes preparation that students might not be aware of. Here are just a few things that are involved.

1. Inspiration – Teachers must develop a concept that might or might not be accepted by potential students. Teachers must stay current and know what is going on in the quilting world to come up with ideas that will attract students. This includes reading magazines, books, blogs, internet lists as well as attending shows, meetings and conferences and talking to colleagues.

2. Samples – Once a concept is developed, samples must be made that will attract students. Fabric, trim, etc, must be selected and auditioned. When a pleasing choice is made, the sample must be constructed. Did it work as planned? *Continued on page 4*

#### Developing a Quilt Class, continued

No? Then it is back to the drawing board and more samples must be made until the right one is finalized. How much time does this take? It can vary; days, weeks and possibly even months depending on the sample and how many prototypes are made.

3. Advertising/Marketing – After the final sample is made, it must be seen by prospective students. Advertising information must be developed that attracts students to the class. The advertising must be distributed; possibly in a website or a blog, at meet-the-teacher-meetings, direct mailings, and/or personally showing samples to shop owners, teacher coordinators, etc. More time and money are involved.

4. Scheduling/Booking – Many teachers do not have a staff to assist them with administrative duties therefore they must coordinate and maintain their own teaching schedule. This involves a lot of record keeping and phone calls with teacher coordinators. Once a class is actually booked, they then have to package and mail class samples and any other materials that must be sent previous to teaching a class. Often a contract is involved, thus creating negotiations and more record keeping.

5. Handouts/Patterns/Instructions – Not all, but many, teachers prepare patterns and detailed instructions to help students during the class. Creating the pattern and handout is best done simultaneously to preparing the sample but this takes a lot of time so it is not always done early on in case the sample does not result in any class bookings. So if the pattern and instructions were not developed when the first sample was created, additional sample(s) are made but this time each step is recorded and this then becomes the set of directions that are distributed in the class. It sounds simple but actually takes a significant amount of time. Some teachers, primarily those who sell patterns and kits, hire a person (at their own expense) to test the directions to make sure the directions are clear and complete.

6. Kits – Kits are complicated in themselves. While students love them, and they can make classroom performance more cohesive, they must be carefully planned. All items going into the kit must be selected, tested and availability determined. And then there is the price. Each item must be sourced for the best possible price. The teacher, who is probably a bit of a gambler at this point, orders and purchases the supplies that go into the kit before most classes are finalized. How much to order? How much to invest in the kits? That is a good question. The teacher must predict how many students will be taking the class and buying kits. Once the items arrive, the kits must be assembled and guess who does the assembling. Yes. Once again it is the teacher doing the administrative work while she is praying that she is not losing money by under pricing the kits since the kit fee had to be determined long before the actual assembly took place.


7. Transportation – Local teachers do not have to make plane reservations and pack for air travel but national teachers do. They must book flights, arrange for local housing and local transportation. They either trust the airlines and carry teaching materials on the plane (and pay hefty baggage fees) or send boxes ahead and trust the shipping company. Teachers not flying to a job don't have to worry about air travel but they still have the issues of packing up their materials, loading up the car, driving to the location, unloading the car and setting up for class. Most teachers usually try to arrive in enough time to get some rest before lecturing or teaching but transportation delays do not always allow this to happen.

So all of this preparation takes place well ahead of the actual class. Teaching the class is the grand finale. Is it worth it? Good question. Teachers, whether they are employed in a public school system or whether they are independent like our beloved quilting teachers, are not paid well. They usually teach because they love to be with people, like to share information and need to supplement the family income. So the next time you take a class, think about all the thought and effort that takes place ahead of time and show some appreciate to the quilt teacher. A sweet smile and a sincere word of thanks mean a lot.



## The Finish(ed) Line

Whether you are an experienced quilter or just learning to stitch; making a prize winner or a quilt to comfort a friend, the stories of our quilts weave in and out to create the tapestry that is our life.



From Patty Miller, a well liked pattern: Not much of a story from me, I started this quilt last year and finished it this year. I love scrappy quilts. I bought the border and center block fabric at Fiddlesticks, went home to my stash to

find the rest. This is the second time I have made this pattern from In the Beginning because I like it so much.



Randi Thompson conquered her fears: I picked up this kit over a year ago for a grandson we were expecting. I found it too hard to do at the time as there is satin, fleece, polar fleece, a taffeta like material and cotton. I conquered my fears and with

seam ripper in hand I did finish it.



Lynne Durrant cherishes memories and friendships: The members of my informal quilt group presented the quilt top to me in December 2009, apologizing that it wasn't done, but

charging me with the task of finishing it up! My beloved corgi/doxie, YoYo is depicted on it, and she was our mascot at meetings. I had to put her down in March 2009, so to be given this quilt top at our Christmas party later that year was an emotional experience to say the least. I was overjoyed and consoled that YoYo was immortalized on it, along with the handiwork of my dear quilting friends. The quilt finally got completed in stages: last summer the quilt was machine quilted and bound, and then this spring surface embellishments, a hang sleeve and label were added to complete it and then hung on my hallway wall near the kitchen. I named it "Best of Show" to depict not only canning jars but also a dog show for YoYo. You'll see YoYo eating her chow in the jar tipped on its side, while YoYo's dog treats are in a jar on the top shelf. I also like the cookbooks on the top shelf and the fringed cloth hanging free above the peppermint jar. I am so proud of this for what it means to me.



Mollie Kluver's quilt comforts a friend: This is a quilt for a friend of mine whose daughter passed away last year from cancer. Her daughter inherited the quilt from her grandmother and it

needed some repairs which I tried to do. The fabrics were mostly shirt, dresses, etc from the 20-30's I think. I wish I could have the knowledge to do it easier, but it turned out okay. I then put the quilt together and my friend (Joan) and I tied the quilt and she took it back to Wyoming, I know this one will give Joan comfort as she remembers her daughter Leslie. We tied the quilt as it was extremely fragile and I was afraid it wouldn't hold up to quilting by machine and I didn't have time to do the hand quilting.



Michele Rousseau says that with the patience of her dear friend she was able to accomplish this quilt: The quilt pattern, Savage Star by Kaye Woods, was taught by my friend, Diana

Sedler, Edgewood, NM, in the "Quilt in the Canyon Quilters" group in 2002. I machine pieced and quilted it in Tijeras, NM and finished it in 2011 in Henderson, NV. It is a Log Cabin strip pieced quilt with 30 different fabrics which includes the black border (and I had all of them in my stash!)




## Please Help! Quilt Tops and Supplies Needed

This year has been an over-active tornado season for areas in the Midwest and South, and two areas were especially hard hit; Tuscaloosa, Alabama and Joplin, Missouri. The Western Alabama Quilters Guild reports there were over 500 structures destroyed within 6 square miles. Four members of the Town and Country Quilters Guild in Joplin lost their homes along with the house that held all the supplies for making their charity quilts. Both these communities and quilt guilds are in serious need as they begin to rebuild.

Desert Quilters sent a \$200.00 donation to each of these guilds to help with their immediate needs as they struggle to comfort a community in distress. Both guilds are working hard as their members personally try to rebuild while still providing their neighbors with charity quilts. The Town and Country Quilters Guild usually provides over 170 charity quilts a year, now they estimate 8000 are needed! The task seems daunting, and we want to help!

We are collecting tops, finished (or partially finished) quilts, orphan blocks, fabric, flannel backing, and small quilt tools to send to our fellow quilters. If you have something to spare, please bring it Karyn Treciak Bruck at the Quilt Las Vegas table at the Quarterly Meeting on July 14th.

If you would like to donate but will not be at the meeting, call Brenda Cook or Karyn Treciak Bruck and we will make arrangements to pick up your items. Collected items will be sorted and shipped to both guilds by July 25th.

## Quilt Las Vegas 2012 Making A Name For Ourselves

I was mistaken, both quilt shops were referring to our show, but I thought it was odd that we are thought of as "the quilt show in Henderson."

Not long after I became chairperson of our show I was chatting on the phone with Brenda Cook and mentioned to her my desire to push the Quilt Las Vegas logo. Peg Cummings came up with this great "brand" name several years ago and our board voted it as our official logo. During our conversation, Brenda suggested using

the Las Vegas sign as an iconic backdrop which would signify that our guild and our quilt show represent all of Las Vegas, not just the Henderson area. While we were chatting, Brenda checked via the internet to see if there were any copyright issues and apparently there are none, in fact, many businesses use the Las Vegas sign for their advertising. ## Quilt Show Notes...Why should I put my piece in for judging?

Two things enter into having a piece judged...one, you want to measure your piece against others and maybe win a ribbon. And two, you want an outside opinion on what you are doing that is excellent and what could use some improvement. Let's face it, will your friends really tell you what they think and do they even have a clue about what you are doing?

When submitting a piece for judging, you probably take a bit more time giving attention to details...you know someone will be looking.

Judging is anonymous...no one knows whose piece is being looked at by the judge. The comments are recorded by scribes who try very hard to get every thought expressed by the judge down properly. The comment sheets go into your envelope and if you choose not to share what was said, no one will know what the comments were.

Occasionally, the comments don't make a lot of sense, sometimes it's that what you were trying to convey didn't quite express itself clearly. Judging is one person's opinion, but it is a person who has training and a lot of experience in looking at quilts/wall hangings. We bring in a different judge each year so you get a slightly different opinion of your work over the years.

Still uncomfortable with having your piece judged? I invite you to sign up to help with judging next year. I guarantee you will learn a lot, and find it is not so scary after all.

Are your friends curious about the judging process and you don't want to wait for the quilt show next year? I will come to your circle meeting and give a talk, with examples of what judges are looking for...even give you a chance to be the judge! Just give me a call.

I look forward to seeing your work in the show next year. And if you still don't want to have your piece judged, we do have a category for non-judged items...but remember, if the show is overflowing with quilts, that category can disappear. So why not just fill out the paperwork and enter your piece for judging...we want to see your work.




