The March 4, 2013, board meeting of DQN was called to order by Karen Garth at 1:35

p. m. at the Humana Guidance Center, Henderson, Nevada. There were 18 in attendance: Karen Garth, Christine Dunn, Michael Coughran, Lana Weber, Bobbie Stember, Kathy Stoick, Sandy Rogers, Kathy Farris, JoAnn D'Angelo, Barbara Gibney, Bonnie Kulwin, Yvonne Higgins, Susan Cocks, Lora Norman, Mary Sprenger, Peggy Cummings, Patsy Musaraca, and Debi Rodriquez.

Minutes from the February 4, 2013, meeting were read by attendees prior to this meeting. Kathy Farris requested that two words be added to the second sentence under Website Task Force: "...that <u>you can</u> get information...." and moved to accept the February minutes with that change. This was seconded by Barbara Gibney. Motion carried.

Treasurer's report was accepted as written. The closing balance for January 31st was \$57,416.24.

Lana Weber presented copies of two forms that she will use to track cash advances for those who need to make purchases on behalf of DQN and need to get the money before the purchase. The new forms will provide a convenient way to account for the expenditures and the return of any unused funds.

Membership: Patsy Musaraca announced that we have 422 members and 69 are brand new! The Membership Directory is still in progress.

2012 Retreat: Peg Cummings reported that she, Yvonne Higgins and Jody Cotton attended the AHA luncheon where the quilt from last year's Retreat was auctioned off. The quilt sold for \$450, but since the auction was closed without announcement during lunch, several people who wanted to bid significantly more did not have the opportunity to do so.

2013 Retreat: Mary Ashcraft and Teri Duffy were not present. Kathy Farris announced the list of teachers and classes planned for the Retreat so far. Since we have 38,000 square feet, almost 3 times as much as last year, there will be room for up to 5 classrooms. Some teaching spots are still open, and anyone interested should contact Kathy Farris.


