HANGING SLEEVE INSTRUCTIONS

Sleeve fabric should be cut 9" wide 5. Pin sleeve to quilt back at top and the exact width of your quilt. edge. Stitch to guilt using a scant 1/4". Width of quilt 9" fold 2. Hem the short side ends, turning 1/4" twice. quilt back 6. Hand stitch sleeve at fold line to back of quilt, using secure stitches. Do not stitch through front of quilt. 3. Fold under 1 1/2" on one long side of the strip Press toward the wrong side of the fabric. Base 1/4" from fold, creating a small tuck. fold fold tuck quilt back 4. Fold in half lengthwise wrong-sides-Sew on binding, then remove together, matching raw edges. basting stitches at tuck to create easement. raw edges tuck fold quilt back

OPTIONAL HANGING TABS FOR WALL HANGINGS AND ART QUILTS

- Tab fabric should be the same as used in the quilt or binding.
- Make tabs by any method you choose. Finished tab should measure approximately 1 inch wide and 2 ½ inches long. At least 2 tabs are needed. The number of tabs you need will be determined by the width of the quilt. Placement of the tabs is decided by the quilter; however the distance between the tabs should not be greater than 10 inches. There are many tab hanging methods available on the Internet
- Tabs can be inserted into the binding or hand stitched to the back.
- Ideally the tabs will lay flat on the back side of the quilt for judging and flip up to reveal approximately 1/2 inch of the tab to be used for hanging.
